

## **Report on CSR and sustainable Development for the period November'24 to March'25**

The details of the Corporation's CSR activities for the period November'24 to March'25

### **Health Care Services**

A Health Centre is run at Lallubhai Compound ( R&R colony) Mankhurd since 2013 in collaboration with "Doctors for you" (DFY), where various health care services are provided to the local public at highly subsidized cost.

The services are provided at the health centre daily, like general OPD, dental OPD, Tuberculosis treatment, Immunization, Growth monitoring OPD, family planning and maternal & child health services. In the health centre at Lallubhai compound, specialized services i.e. physiotherapy and disability rehabilitation, Gynecology clinic, Eye clinic and Skin disease, Psychiatric, heart ailment treatment etc. are also provided. The OPD services are backed up by laboratory services and pharmacy. With the opening of this health centre, quality health services are easily accessible and affordable to residents of these PAP resettlement colonies and nearby slum areas. The Health Centre has been providing healthcare services to more than 7.5 lakh people since its inception.

## **Maternal and Child Health Care:**

- **Antenatal care to Pregnant Women:**

Continuum of care approach is used to provide maternal and child health services at Health Care center which includes services for – maternal (Antenatal care for pregnant women), newborn care, child health services (immunization), etc.

- **Immunization services:**

Immunization services are provided at the Centre and on field through outreach services. Routine Immunization is carried out at the center twice a week on Monday and Thursday, while outreach immunization on field is carried out on daily basis for under five years of age. Vaccination is given against TB, Diphtheria, Pertussis, Tetanus, Hemophilus influenzae B, Hepatitis B, Polio, Rotavirus, Measles, Rubella.

- **De-worming against protozoal infection:-**

Soil Transmitted infections caused by a group of parasites such as worms/hookworm are among the most common infections in children. Those living in poverty are most vulnerable to this infection which can impair their nutrient intake, digestion and absorption causing infectious diarrhea. Deworming against protozoal infection is supplemented with immunization.

- **Vitamin A Supplementation to prevent blindness and infections in children:**

Vitamin A deficiency can cause visual impairment like night blindness and increase risk of infection in children. Vitamin A Deficiency affects about 190 million preschool age children (as per WHO e-library of Evidence for Nutrition Actions). Vitamin A is supplemented by immunization.

- **Tuberculosis:**

Activities at the Centre for Tuberculosis.

1. Home environment: Importance of environment (such as space, ventilation and overcrowding) in the prevention of the spread of TB & the importance of adherence to treatment and completing the complete course of AKT is explained here by DOTS provider. They also emphasize the problem associated with irregular treatment.
2. Awareness among family members:  
The family members are educated about mode of TB transmission, precaution to be taken to prevent the spread of disease and Importance of timely intake of medicines and development of drug resistance due to incomplete and inadequate treatment. Family members are also advised to visit the health center in case of symptoms such as Cough (>2Weeks), Fever and decreased appetite.
